As I write this Easter is almost upon us – in just a few days we will be celebrating the Resurrection of Christ. That journey through the Triduum will be over. Once again you can take up the chocolate, biscuits or wine that you have perhaps given up for Lent; put away the Lenten reading that you meant to do but didn't get beyond page 4; the roast lamb will be consumed; the Easter eggs eaten. 






'The Poisonwood Bible' is an epic novel of a family's tragic undoing and efforts to rebuild what's been lost.

Nathan Price, an extreme evangelical Baptist, decides to take his wife, four daughters to go out to the Belgian Congo at the beginning of the 1960s. They went with what they considered the essentials to settle in the new country but soon realised that all that was useless and their lives would be changed forever. It took me a while to get into this book, but halfway through (it is over 600 pages long) I was completely absorbed into their lives and how Africa changed them all. Having spent the first 25 years of my life in Africa I was able to appreciate how the spirit of that continent never leaves you.

Barbara Kingsolver is an American novelist. She is the only author to win the Women's Prize for Fiction twice, both for 'the Lacuna' in 2010 and 'Demon Copperfield' in 2023. She has also won the PEN/Faulkner prize for fiction and the James Tait Black Memorial Prize for Fiction.


# WHY DO WE CELEBRATE EASTER?

HE IS RISEN

Easter marks the culmination of the Passion of Jesus, occurring after 40 days of Lent where Christians fast, pray and undertake acts of penance.
Easter is considered the holiest day of the year.

Easter is a Christian holiday celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ. According to Christian history, Jesus was crucified on a Friday (Good Friday) and rose again three days later on Easter Sunday.

Easter, is a Christian festival and cultural holiday commemorating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, described in the New Testament as having occurred on the third day of his burial following his crucifixion by the Romans at Calvary c. 30 AD.L.




Jesus' resurrection is
essentially the foundation upon
which Christian religions are
built. Christians believe that
Jesus was arrested by the
Romans because he claimed to be
the son of God.



Easter is the celebration of Jesus conquering death when he was resurrected from the dead, and this is connected with the celebration of spring arriving and bringing new life, leaving the cold winter behind.



Eggs represent life and rebirth, and in Christianity, this became associated with Jesus's crucifixion and resurrection. Early Christian communities of Mesopotamia stained eggs red in memory of Jesus, beginning the tradition. Today, it's common to give out chocolate eggs for Easter.

THIS TRIP HAD BEEN CAREFULLY PLANNED TO LINK IN WITH THEIR GEOGRAPHY CURRICULUM AND THE CHIL/DREN LEARNT LOTS ABOUT THE DIFFERENT ANIMALS AT THE FARM AND HOW THEY ARE LOOKED AFTER BY THEIR KEEPERS. THEY ALSO MADE GREAT USE OF THE PLAY EQUIPMENT AVAILABLE. THEY WERE BUZZING WITH INFORMATION WHEN THEY RETURNED AND KEEN TO TELL EVERYBODY ABOUT WHAT THEY HAD SEEN. AND EXPERIENCED ON THE TRIP. IT SEEMS THE DEER WERE A

WE'RE SO PROUD OF HOW MUCH OUR CHILDREN ENJOY BEING ACTIVE. OVER ONE THIRD OF OUR KS2 CHILDREN ARE CURRENTLY TRAINING TWICE A WEEK IN SCHOOL TO TAKE PART IN THE WEST BERKSHIRE AND NORTH HANTS CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS. OUR YEAR 3 CHILDREN ARE CONTINUING TO CHAMPIONSHIPS. OUR YEAR 3 CHILDREN ARE CONTINUING TO MAKE GREAT PROGRESS IN THEIR SWIMMING LESSONS AND THIS TERM YEAR 3, 4 AND YEAR 5 CHILDREN ARE RECEIVING WEEKLY TAG RUGBY COACHING SESSIONS FROM TADLEY TIGERS RUGBY CUB. IN ADDITION, YEARS 1, 2 AND 6 ARE RECEIVING EXTERNAL COACHING IN BAT AND BALL SKILLS THIS TERM. IT'S FAIR TO SAY THAT THE KS2 FOOTBALL CLUB IS ALSO QUITE POPULAR.

#### Mrs Lorraine Weight MBE January 1934 – November 2023

We were saddened to share the news of Mrs Weight's passing back in November to our school community, she was just shy of celebrating her 90th birthday. We spoke with current pupils, previous pupils, previous headteachers, parents and many more – she truly touched so many people in the 50 years we were blessed to have her working alongside us at Woolhampton C of E Primary School.

On what would have been her 90 th birthday, we held a beautiful school memorial service where we looked back and remembered the many great memories we had of Mrs Weight, finishing off with our year 6's reading out their personal poems for her.


Mrs Weight began working at our school when her son Dean was a pupil, teaching the children how to sew and knit. The Headteacher at the time saw just how great she was and asked her to join the staffing team. She would greet children in the mornings and said goodbye to them at the end of the day by the gate. During the day she would help in the classrooms, organise lunches and lunch time play and also run clubs. She was a busy lady but loved her job. She wanted children to enjoy school and to help them in their learning. Her philosophy was – make it enjoyable and the children will learn. She always called the children her little darlings because that's what they were to her.

She was full of fun and laughter and would come to school dressed as though she was going out on a dinner date. She looked so glamourous with her beautiful glitz dresses and jewellery. The children loved to see what she was wearing each day and she always said that she dressed for the children. She was sometimes mistaken for the headmistress much to the amusement of the head teachers at the time. At the school fayres there was always a bric a brac stall run by Mrs Weight to raise funds for school or another charity. She knitted thousands of twiddle muffs which went to help people in hospital suffering from dementia. She knitted dog blankets for the dog's home and teddy's to send out to Africa. She was always busy!

Mrs Weight loved to accompany the children on school journeys be it to the Isle of Wight, Osmington Bay or where ever they went and she looked after the children while they were away from home. In the evenings she would give them hot chocolate and biscuits and made sure they were safely tucked up in bed. She comforted those who were homesick and thought up fun games to play. She seemed to know when children needed comfort and support. One of the most important jobs she did was to help those children who found learning to read difficult. Mrs Weight would support them and play games to improve their confidence in decoding and of course she made it fun.

Mrs Weight was a wonderful kind, patient and nurturing lady who loved working with children and received her MBE from Prince Charles, now King Charles, for her Services to Education. She was a remarkable lady and a great friend to staff and children. Teachers, pupils, past and present will have so many special memories of her that will be treasured for many years to come.
